

Overview

In this History based topic the children will be looking at the period of the Anglo-Saxons and how they invaded and settled in Britain. They will also find out what was discovered at Sutton Hoo. The children will look at Saxon villages, buildings and everyday life in Saxon times and compare these to life and houses today. Children will be able to explain who the Saxons worshipped and some of their beliefs.

Properties and changes to materials

- I can compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties, including hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity (electrical and thermal), and response to magnets.
- I know that some materials dissolve in liquid to form a solution.
- I can describe how to recover a substance from a solution.
- I can use my knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how mixtures might be separated, including through filtering, sieving, evaporating.
- I can give reasons, based on evidence for comparative and fair tests for the particular uses of everyday materials, including metals wood and plastic.
- I can demonstrate that dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes.
- I can explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials, and that this kind of change is not usually reversible, including changes associated with burning and the action of acid on bicarbonate of soda.

Outcomes.

By the end of this unit children will know when in history the Anglo-Saxons were, where they came from and where in Britain they invaded and settled. Children will be able to explain what was discovered at Sutton Hoo. Children will be able to compare everyday Saxon life including clothing, jobs and villages with life today. In Maths they will be learning how to multiply and divide and then they will be learning fractions and decimals. In English, children will be reading the life of a Saxon boy. They will then plan write their own Saxon myth. In Science, children will be learning about changes to materials. In Art they will be designing jewellery and shields.
