<p>The quality of education</p> <p>Desired outcomes by July 2021</p> <p>What will we see:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Embed and sustain 'Mission Possible Curriculum' and opportunities to increase cultural capital in the current climate ✓ Curriculum is successfully adapted and ambitious to meet the needs of pupils with SEND and GDS ✓ Teachers have good knowledge of the subjects they teach; leaders provide effective support for those teaching outside their main areas of expertise ✓ All teachers provide direct and clear feedback and children's work demonstrates positive response to feedback ✓ Teachers are confident that children can remember and apply what they've been taught into new and unfamiliar concepts. Consistent planning formats for all subjects that identifies relevant prior learning as a starting point (eg retrieval practice such as quizzes) ✓ A revised format to pupil progress meetings enables teachers to take quick and decisive action to support identified pupils (use of resilience framework - introduce Dec '20) ✓ All reportable outcomes to be above national average at ARE & GDS. ✓ Reading is a pleasurable experience for our learners.
